Very disappointing news on The Meadow as the Judge did not agree with Tewkesbury Borough Council and therefore the Planning Inspector's decision to permit planning still stands.

The Council is currently involved in several large projects and these include the renovation of the tennis courts and the renovation of the play area within Freeman Field. We are also looking to install electric vehicle charging points within the Village and The Shutter's car park might well be a possibility.

Solar panels on the RRB are in early stages of discussions but in the present climate this is something that should be considered and examined closely.

Our footpaths are in need of some urgent TLC and extensive work is ongoing regarding improvements together with more user friendly stiles.

Other work includes replacing the gazebo in the bottom corner of Freeman Field. The last inspection of this shows that repairs would cost a lot of money and there comes a time when replacement is a more sensible solution.

We have been given 2 oak saplings from The Honourable Company of Gloucestershire as part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 and thoughts as to where these can be planted are still up for debate!

There is also a need to bring more colour into the Village such as flower boxes and perhaps giving Shutter Island a make-over etc.

We have an awful lot going on at the moment and we do need help in carrying out all of the tasks that the Council are involved in. So, if you feel that you will like to help and get involved then please contact the Clerk for more information or give me ring if that is easier.

No Mobile Phone Signal? Poor Reception? If you suffer from this problem, then let's come together to try and get this important issue resolved.

In January a small band of volunteers will be knocking on doors and gathering information about your mobile phone reception. They will clearly identify themselves and explain the purpose of their visit.

These are the questions they will ask and you will also be asked if you agree for us to petition the mobile phone providers on your behalf to erect a mast to improve mobile phone reception in the village.

- **Reception:** Please mark out of ten (with 1 being very poor / nonexistent – 10 being excellent)

And please remember – the reception we need to know about is when your phone is NOT connected via wifi / broadband.

*There are three main categories for antisocial behaviour*, *depending on how many people are affected:* 

- *Personal antisocial behaviour is when a person targets a specific individual or group.*
- Nuisance antisocial behaviour is when a person causes trouble, annoyance or suffering to a community.
- Environmental antisocial behaviour is when a person's actions affect the wider environment, such as public spaces or buildings
