

It's the time to gather in fruits and crops from fields, gardens and hedgerows to preserve them in jams and jellies - or to put things in the freezer, so that we can enjoy them during the winter. on the pavement. This is very important as all residents have the right to not have light shining into their bedrooms. We thank you for your help in this matter.

The playing field is popular on weekends and parking is proving to be an issue again. Along with the football club, we are taking steps to ask visitors to not park on pavements and not block residents access to their properties. We have spoken to the local PCSO and asked them to attend during these times to ensure compliance.

For many years there was access into the fields which belong to Moat Farm to retrieve footballs but as the riding stable has closed, and the owner now plants crops in the field and keeps livestock, this is no longer possible. As such, we have removed the stiles. Can we remind all residents this is private property. GPC plan to install high ball netting to limit the need as soon as possible but until then please knock at the door to Moat Farm to request return of any balls which go over.

Can we also remind residents that in a rural area, if they wish to walk a footpath but there is livestock in the field, especially cows, they could use caution and follow the advice in The Countryside Code which can be found at www.gov.uk and always keep dogs on a lead.

The unit has now been ordered and with the help of the GET team, we have made the payment and are hoping the installation will be completed in the first few weeks of November. We would like to thank the GET team very much for all their fundraising during village events to help us secure this valuable equipment. We would also thank Nikki Keen for her ongoing support to manage the units. We have received a charity donation of fresh red paint and a contact to get replacement glazing at the top which says DEFIBRILATOR instead of TELEPHONE. If anyone would like to help with the renovation of the unit, just contact me.

You will be aware that we have recently lost the fight for Trumans Farm. This is very sad news, and we thank the residents' group who worked so hard to develop the best possible defence. This was based entirely on TBC not being able to demonstrate the required 5-year land supply. We will continue to work with the residents' groups to achieve the best outcome as we move forward into detailed planning.

The new road layout in Bishops Cleeve is causing some concern. We ask residents to be very careful while everyone gets used to the new priority and if you have any specific concerns, please let us know and we can relay these to the highways department.

Recently, we have received several complaints about excessively bright security lights on properties. We are a recognised low light area so we would ask all residents to look at your own lights and ensure they are only as bright as necessary to illuminate your own property. They should not shine onto neighbouring properties. If they are PIR controlled, they should only be activated when someone enters your own property and not when passing by
